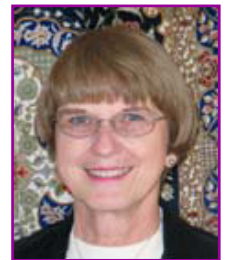

The Christian Life Committee is busy planning a relaxing, comfortable retreat for all the ladies in the LWML Oregon District. We hope you will invite your friends to come and enjoy a time of fellowship, being in The Word and....*singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.* --Colossians 3:16 ESV

The dates for the Retreat are Friday, September 30th to Sunday, October 2, 2011 to be held at Aldersgate Camps and Retreats – The Hilltop Lodge – Turner, Oregon.

The registration fee is \$130.00. This includes all printed materials, lodging for Friday and Saturday nights; **Friday** dinner, **Saturday** breakfast, lunch & dinner; **Sunday** brunch.

### PRIOR TO THE RETREAT.....

The LWML Oregon District will meet in the same facility as the Retreat:

- ★ Thursday, Sept. 29th the EC will meet and the EC and BOD will meet Friday Sept. 30th,
- ★ Probably closing around 3:00 PM ....Registration for the retreat begins at 4:30 pm.

For BOD members and guests, i.e. ladies traveling with a Bd. Member, there is an optional registration fee of \$168.00 (\$130.00 + \$38.00) This includes all printed retreat materials, lodging for Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. You are on your own for Thursday dinner but this registration fee includes **Friday** breakfast, lunch & dinner; **Saturday** breakfast, lunch & dinner, **Sunday** brunch.

### (3 Nights 7 meals Package)

The Hilltop Lodge is very "comfortable". The main meeting room has two bedrooms for guest speakers, Bible study leaders, etc.; a bathroom in each bedroom and two bathrooms for the meeting room. We will be served our meals in the lodge, plus coffee, tea etc. All the bedrooms are in a second wing, only a few feet away from the meeting room. The rooms sleep from 7 to 8 people and each room has its own bathroom (with shower). Linens will be placed on the beds for you to make up. 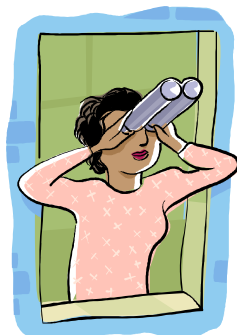

# Spiritual Development and Growth

## Hypocrisy is a Deadly Game

It has often been said that “Christians are hypocrites”. I have heard that many times in the span of time I have been ministering. It is not an easy thing to hear. Hypocrisy is like trying to fool or lie to yourself. A person may have an alcohol addiction themselves and all the while they are talking about the “evils of drinking” to everyone they know. Ultimately who are they trying to comfort? Are they comforting themselves or are they simply trying to blame others so that they don’t look so bad?

Perhaps another example would be an organization that touts to support a certain type of spiritual orientation and then finds itself not supporting that spiritual orientation. They may speak to support, but they really don’t. Who are they trying to fool? Who are they trying to comfort? Perhaps it is only to look the best to the greatest number of people. It is like a political lie. Tell the people what they want to hear so that you can gain their money, efforts and attention.

Whether it is an individual, group, or public organization, hypocrisy is a deadly game. Jesus Christ the Savior of all mankind had to deal with people and groups of people that displayed this type of behavior all the time. The Pharisees and teachers of the law were two groups that were constantly guilty of acting in hypocrisy. During Jesus’ time of ministry, these two groups were considered “the power group” of the church at large. In Matthew 23 Jesus rails at the teachers of the law and the Pharisees. Here is an excerpt.

*27 "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You are like whitewashed tombs, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of dead men's bones and everything unclean. 28 In the same way, on the outside you appear to people as righteous but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness." (NIV)*

Hypocrisy amounts to lying to yourself. These were God’s people and yet, they were acting in such a way that they had put on a fake façade. They can play head games with God all they want, but in the end God can see everything.

What about your life? How have you given into hypocrisy? Hypocrisy can end in only one way, that is in eternal death and separation from God in hell. Will you let hypocrisy get the best of you? Like all sin, hypocrisy condemns, but **Christ Jesus our Lord gives life!** Acknowledging who we are is very important. When we realize our sin and confess them to the Lord he freely forgives. **His answer to forgiveness is always YES!**

That is the good news for us. Jesus went to the cross to save us from our sin, we have life and forgiveness in His name because of what he has done. What then becomes of all those who claim to be “Christian” and still sin? What about Christians that are hypocrites? The sin of a Christian is dealt with by what Christ has done for us in perfect behavior for us, and in his suffering and death on the cross. His resurrection guarantees that we will be with him and we will be raised from the dead, too. Everyone in all the world sins, but **with Christ Jesus we have life and forgiveness in His name.**

It is my sincere prayer that you tell yourself the truth; that your behavior and speech would match, and that where you fail, **may you find comfort in Christ Jesus who loved us enough to come to this world to save us**, even from ourselves.

"December 14 was a landmark day for the Good Shepherd Lutheran Group Home in Palmar Arriba, as six orphans made their first visit to their new home! Yes, Praise God, an agreement has finally been made between Good Shepherd Lutheran Homes and the Dominican government-CONANI for the 'custodianship' of six orphans with developmental disabilities into our pilot group home project. The six selected youth will slowly make the transition to living full time at their new home in Palmar Arriba over the next six weeks. Please keep them and their new 'aunts and uncles' (caretakers) in your prayers over this time of adjustment.

"After three years of planning and working on this project we are grateful to the Lord, who has heard our prayers, and now we celebrate this early Christmas present. Please continue to pray for us and that our new residents would see their new house become a 'home.' Two of these orphans have the last name 'Conani,' which is actually the name of the institution in which they previously lived. These orphans come to us without having had a place to call their own, something most of us do not understand, but Christ does, as He entered the world without a home, and made His first bed in a manger.

"We would like to thank all who, in last month's prayers, have been praying for us and the opening of the group home, and we would ask this month, that those prayers would be returned to the Lord as prayers of thanksgiving!

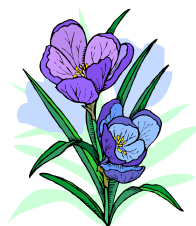

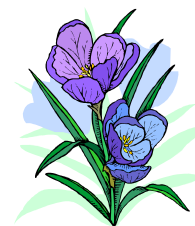

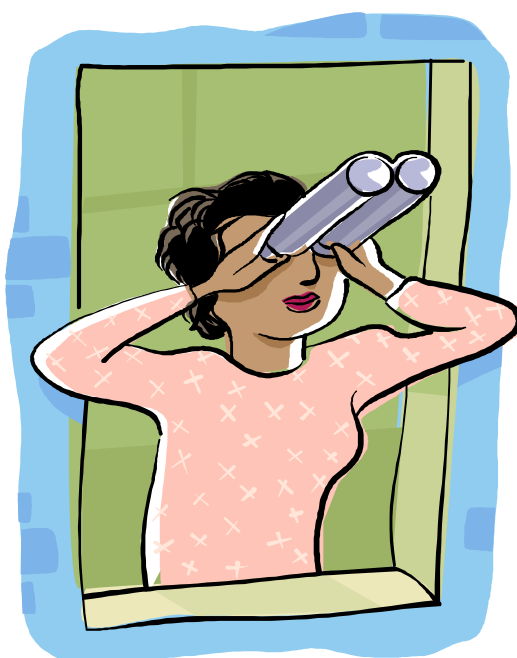

So, are you ready for the **best** New Year's resolution? The most important one!

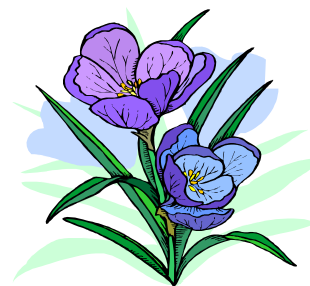

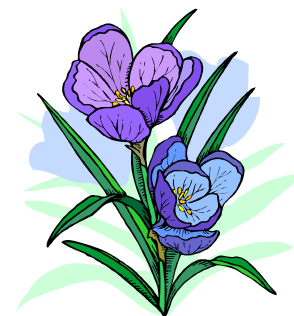
